Spiritual Reflection for Sunday, August 22, 2021

Joshua 24:1-2a, 15-17, 18b Ephesians 5:21-32 John 6:60-69

We find a challenging parallel in our readings today, particularly in the Book of Joshua and in the continuation of Jesus' Bread of Life Discourse in the Gospel of John. Joshua is urging



the Lord's flock in his midst to make a choice: forsake false gods, leave behind sin and all the things that keep them enslaved to what does not truly sustain, and choose life instead - choose the Lord who has led them, provided them, and freed them to be his own. The crowd around Jesus, too, has a choice before them—take Jesus at his word and follow, or grumble, give up, and say what Jesus offers is too hard..."who can accept it?" (Jn 6:60).

Today, reflect on where you stand in this same cross-road. If what Jesus says really is true, then ultimately his Word must take the highest priority in our hearts and in our life. His flesh and blood, His Word, gives us Spirit and life. He guides us and sustains us not only now, but also for eternal life. Don't walk away! Don't return to your "former way of life" (cf. Jn. 6:66). Confidently entrust yourself and your family to the loving embrace of the Lord of Life! "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord" (Jos 24:15). "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God" (Jn. 6:68-69).


