

<u>Spiritual Reflection for Sunday August 8, 2021</u> <u>Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time</u>

Kings 19:4-8 Ephesians 4:30-5:2 John 6:41-51

St. Paul, who wrote the letter to the Ephesians, has the experience of his own conversion to Christ to reflect on when he sees the activity of those who have come to believe in the only Son of God. Today he writes the early believers in Ephesus and



says "Brothers and sisters: Do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with which you were sealed for the day of redemption. All bitterness, fury, anger, shouting, and reviling must be removed from you, along will all malice." Considering this charge, many may have figured that being faithful to Christ was an unobtainable goal.

Given the description above concerning how we grieve the Holy Spirit, most of us would agree that we sin against the Spirit on a continual basis. How do we change our attitude and habits? St. Paul suggest that we become imitators of God, living in love, as Christ has loved us. This change in attitude must be undertaken slowly. Forgiveness and acceptance is never a quick proposition. Let us select one person that we need to forgive or accept. Let us begin to pray for that person, not that God changes that person to suit us, but that God changes both that individual and us so that we can accept each other. It is in this acceptance that we truly will stop grieving the Holy Spirit and get about the business of furthering the Kingdom of God!

You can start with one or the other, but you will need to have completed sufficient instruction AND be attending regular services before you can become a full member of the Catholic faith.

Rite of Candidacy - August 14 - 4pm Mass

As he concludes his Pastoral Year at Holy Cross, our seminarian James Buttner will be celebrating the Rite of Admission to Candidacy. This is a special moment in his discernment and seminary formation when the Bishop receives him as a candidate for future ordination. James will express his intention to complete his formation and move toward ordination to the priesthood. Join us for this exciting occasion as part of the 4pm Vigil Mass on Saturday, August 14th. Reception will follow when you will get a chance to congratulate and to wish James well as he returns to his studies.

<u>The Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary</u> <u>August 14 & 15</u>

As a spoken prayer, the Rosary has its origins in the words of Scripture. The Rosary includes the perfect prayer that Our Lord taught to his Apostles, the Our Father. It also includes the Hail Mary, which brings together the Angelic Salutation found in Lk. 1:28 and the words of St. Elizabeth in Lk. 1:42. In addition, the Glory Be, an ancient Christian doxology, and a few other



traditional elements (e.g., the Apostles' Creed, and the Salve Regina) help to form the whole of the Rosary.

Pray the Rosary! August 14, 4:00PM (Chapel) and August 15 (Church), after all Masses. We will pray the Glorious Mysteries of the Rosary. Bring your Rosary. If you need one, blessed Rosaries will be available as you enter Church. How to Pray the Rosary sheets and pamphlets will also be available to pick up.
