Scriptural Reflection for Sunday August 9, 2020 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time

I Kings 19:9a, 11-13a

Psalm 85: 9, 10, 11-12, 13-14

Romans 9: 1-5 Matthew 14: 22-33

The disciples of Jesus are on the water heading to the opposite shore where they were to wait for Jesus. The disciples experience a terrible storm, their faith falters and they fear for their lives. This is another example of the lack of faith exhibited by the disciples.



The fear of drowning is real, no matter if it is in water or drowning in the struggles of daily life. We count on the people "in the boat" with us to help us but at times we find we must turn to God in our fear. Should the disciples have been able to handle the storm by themselves in today's Gospel? If they had remembered that Christ was always with them, they would not have put Christ to the test. Peter says, "Command me to come to you on the water." Jesus said, "Come". As Peter begins to walk on the water, his fear takes over and he begins to sink. Peter cries out "Lord, save me." Of course, Christ does save him but asks why he ever doubted.

Today we should ask why we ever doubt in Christ. When we call out to Christ for help, do we have the courage to do as Christ instructs us? Do we have the faith to encourage others to also trust?






