This Weekend's Reflection

First Reading: Sirach 27:30-28:7 Psalm 103 Second Reading: Romans 14:7-9 Gospel: Matthew 10:21-35

Today in our readings we hear a lot of talk about wrath and anger. These two emotions are seen in our first reading as well as our gospel. We are called this weekend to focus on our own lives and how we treat both ourselves and



others around us. In the opening of the reading from Sirach today we hear that wrath and anger are hateful things, yet the sinner hugs tight to them. Do we ever get caught up in these things or hold grudges against people? In our gospel today we hear of a man who settles his accounts with his servants. The two servants beg the king for mercy and in time he will pay back his debt. The first servant is forgiven and the one who owes a much smaller debt is put in prison until he can repay the debt. What we can learn from this gospel is both patience and forgiveness. While we must learn to forgive, this is going to take time, both on our part as well as the person we are forgiving. How fast are we to condemn others when they have wronged us before we may see their side of the story? Are we open to listening to what they have to say or are our ears closed off so much that we are oblivious when they want to speak with us? Our psalm refrain this weekend reminds us how we are to be kind and merciful, slow to anger, and rich in compassion. Are we like that to those we encounter? Do we do as Christ tells Peter today and forgive not only seven times, but seventy-seven times? It is not always easy to forgive, but we are called to forgive those who have wronged us, even if it takes time; we must be able to learn and accept forgiveness. Who in your life today needs forgiveness? Have you been harboring any negative emotions against anyone? How can you take the steps necessary to forgive those around you?


Private Prayer Hours
