Spiritual Reflection for Sunday Sept. 20, 2020 The Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Isaiah 55: 6-9 Psalm: 145 Philippians 1:20c-24, 27a Matthew 20: 1-16a



Our need for love and appreciation by others is un-

questioned. This love and appreciation gives meaning and motion to our lives. In the gospel today, those hired first who labored under the heat of the day do not feel appreciated! Indeed, they feel cheated and used.

If we are honest, we too may feel cheated. Imagine the person in the family or the co-worker that always seems to have an easier time in life than you do. Do we accuse God of not being fair to us when this occurs? If we do, we must remember that someone else probably thinks the same about us. It is the old idea that the grass is always greener on the other side.

The workers in the gospel who worked the entire day may not have understood. The landowners, not offering them work, rejected them and caused them to suffer. Imagine how appreciated they felt when they received a full day's pay!

Let us consider our own sin today. Christ forgives our sins; we know that. We will ultimately see the kingdom of God. Does it really matter if we feel appreciated all the time? Does it matter if those around us seem to have an easier life than we do? I suggest that it does not and should not matter. What is important is that we all appreciate the goodness of God.



Bishop Lucia has **opened** the parishes in the Diocese of Syracuse. Holy Cross has reopened for all weekend liturgies. Daily Masses are also open. To remain in compliance with current government restrictions on the number of individuals allowed to gather, we kindly ask that you register for Sunday Mass, Daily Mass and Adoration (Wed. evenings) using our scheduling system that can be found on our website. "My Heart started beating today!" During this first amazing month of life, the baby grows to 10,000 times his/her size at conception. The child is totally dependent upon their mother. Between mother and child lies the vital organ called the placenta. Here vessels from mother and baby intertwine without joining, highlighting their newly formed relationship-mutual, nourishing and deeply connected. By the third week the baby's tiny heart begins to beat. Pray that the Lord of Life might move the heart of the baby's mother to give her child the most precious gift of all..

We hope you picked up or clipped out the Spiritual Adoption Prayer from the bulletin. Please name the baby you are adopting and pray daily for him or her and the mom. We did not have a signup but know we are all praying together for these babies. Keep an eye on the bulletin and posters in the Church as we continue to show the development of your baby in the womb. One month - can you imagine that little tiny heartbeat? You might want to read Psalm 139:13-16. These verses are a good reminder of God's loving creation of each of us.
